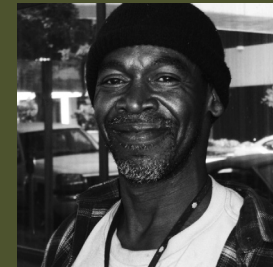

STORIES OF IMPACT

Our 2016 report, *Housing Not Handcuffs: Ending the Criminalization of Homelessness in U.S. Cities*, analyzes laws in 187 cities on the criminalization of homeless individuals, which have been measured and monitored across the country since 2006. This national report was researched and prepared by the Law Center and Sullivan & Cromwell LLP.



Although the McKinney-Vento Act gives students the legal right to stay in the same school when they become homeless, across the country thousands of homeless children are denied access to education every day. In partnership with the Law Center's Project LEARN, Goldman Sachs and Sullivan & Cromwell helped to organize a free legal clinic for families of children and youth experiencing homelessness in Queens, NY.
